This will definitely accelerate the development of regional science and benefit all regions in the globalizing world.

- **Background:** Short summary of relevant background and problem addressed.
- **Objectives:** Define the "tangible and measurable" objectives of the work presented in the paper.
- Methodology: Describe briefly the methodology that you are using or have

used to achieve your objectives.

Results: Provide a short summary of the results.
